Services for Adults Abused in Institutions

This leaflet provides information on services available for adults who experienced abuse, trauma or neglect in institutions. This information may also be useful for partners or relatives of people with these experiences.

This abuse may also have been experienced in the family, or in the community and may have been physical, emotional or sexual abuse, or neglect.

The services and support groups in this leaflet were established after it became recognised that a large number of adults had been abused as children in Ireland.

Benefits of Using Support Services

If you have experienced abuse and it is affecting your life today, we would encourage you to make use of these services.

Talking to someone about experiences you have had may be a great relief and help you to take more control of your life today.

The organisations detailed below provide a range of services including education and training, phone counselling, face to face counselling and supportive information and advice.



Aislinn Centre

The Aislinn Education and Support Centre is based in Dublin and provides healing for survivors of institutional abuse.

It does this through providing education and training in a supportive environment, to help people develop their skills and gain employment. Courses can be taken in areas such as computers, drama, art, cookery or personal development.

Connect

Connect is a free phone support and counselling service for any adult who experienced abuse, trauma or neglect in childhood. The service is also available to partners or relatives of people with these experiences.

With Connect you can talk in confidence with a trained counsellor who can listen or help with questions you have. Connect is an out of hours service available Wednesday to Sunday, from 6-10pm.

National Counselling Service (NCS)

The HSE National Counselling Service (NCS) is for adults who were abused in childhood and was established in September 2000 in response to the recognition that a large number of adults had been abused as children while in care in State institutions in Ireland. This followed the public apology by the Taoiseach in May 1999.

The NCS offers confidential face to face counselling, free of charge, to adults who experienced physical, emotional, sexual abuse or neglect during childhood. Counselling is available at 60 locations throughout Ireland.
